Regrettably, transportation regulations, such as CMV 125E, are being flagrantly violated. The lack of action from the Road Transport Authority is an open secret. The non-enforcement of these rules has led to a surge in the brutal trafficking and slaughter of animals, which are otherwise protected by law. This situation has escalated without any fear of legal repercussions or authorities, rendering these potent laws ineffective and reducing them to mere pieces of paper. This alarming situation underscores the urgent need for stringent implementation of animal welfare laws.

**authorities very seriously and took our petition as tool to bring authorities from heaven to earth.**

Court passed perceptible directions for all authorities as interim order on 6<sup>th</sup> August 2019 and on 14<sup>th</sup> June 2013. In para no 8 Court wrote,

*This being a very serious matter... "We are not only concerned with the transportation or rather illegal transportation of animals for festive occasions, we are concerned with the aspect of preventing cruelty to them otherwise as well. In the circumstances, we would expect first a compliance affidavit so as to denote the fulfilment of the pre-conditions which are mandatory in character without which such animals which are brought in the city in contravention of the above regime can be seized, the vehicles can also be taken into custody, the prosecution can be launched and the guilty brought to book. It is not then permissible for anybody to release the animals or the seized material, including the vehicles."*

Besides this, Hon. Court issued various strict directions in their interim orders to Police and Road Transport Authorities.

These notices pertain to the annual granting of licenses by the Mumbai Municipal Corporation for the sacrifice of sheep and goats on unlicensed and designated premises outside the Deonar abattoir during the three-day festival of Bakri Eid. Upon receiving the tip, ABKGSS promptly alerted the Directorate of Shipping, DGFT, Pune Customs, SP Ratnagiri, Collector Ratnagiri, and the Directorate of Animal Husbandry (Pune). Despite these efforts, in absence of deterred action by responsible authorities the vessel left the port on April 20, 2023, at 2 am, with all animals aboard,

ABKGSS and its allies, including Dhyan Foundation volunteers and advocates, were in constant touch with all responsible agencies and all were vehemently pursuing for action.

The Indian Coast Guard, acting on further alerts from ABKGSS, intercepted the vessel 90 nautical miles from the port and escorted it back to Angre port (Ratnagiri). A raid conducted by customs, with police assistance, led to the ship's master admitting to frequent undocumented international travel, including visits to Pakistan. The raid resulted in the seizure of numerous forged documents, rubber stamps, and letterheads of customs and port authorities, along with other contraband goods.

Tragically, approximately 60 goats and sheep were found dead due to deplorable conditions. All crew members were arrested. This incident has been identified as a significant anti-national conspiracy, and top intelligence agencies have taken over the investigation.

Krishi Go Seva Sangh (ABKGSS) took massive efforts to prevent this smuggling from Indian port to Gulf countries for slaughtering. Incident involving severe mistreatment of livestock during their transport from Angre Port to Ahmednagar, and subsequently to Nandasan, Gujarat. The animals endured extreme cruelty, suffocation, overcrowding, and starvation, leading to a distressing journey that resulted in a fatal disease outbreak and the untimely death of all the goats and sheep involved.

A writ petition (ST No. 9503 of 2023) has been filed in the Bombay High Court by the Dhyan Foundation, with ABKGSS spearheading the case. Our team of dedicated advocates is pursuing legal action against the Customs authorities for their negligence, which directly contributed to this tragic loss of animal life.

Furthermore, this case has unveiled a significant illegal operation masquerading as legitimate animal transportation. This anti-national syndicate has been apprehended, putting an end to their illicit activities that not only harm animals but also threaten the integrity of our nation.
